- **REGULAR:** Any person who has conducted research relating to neuroscience.
- **POSTDOC:** Any person who has obtained their doctoral degree and is currently working in a postdoctoral training position.
- **STUDENT***: Any person currently enrolled in a graduate degree-granting program.
- UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT*: Any person currently enrolled in an undergraduate degree-granting program.
- **EMERITUS:** Any person currently a Regular SfN member with confirmed Emeritus status from their institution. They receive access to ALL of SfN's member benefits without dues, PLUS complimentary annual meeting registration.
- AFFILIATE: Any person interested in the Society's objectives and in participating in the Society's functions but not eligible for another membership category. Applicants for Affiliate membership must still obtain two sponsors. Affiliate members may not submit abstracts for the annual meeting.

2017 REDUCED DUES COUNTRY LIST

To support neuroscientists and students residing in resource-restricted areas of the world and to encourage international participation in the Society and its programs, the Society for Neuroscience (SfN) offers reduced membership dues to residents of the countries listed below. The countries are divided into three categories using the World Bank's categorization of countries by income level.

- SfN's Reduced Dues Category I corresponds to the category of "low-income economies" (having a gross national income (GNI) per capita of \$1,0245 or less).
- SfN's Reduced Dues Category II includes countries in the category of "lower-middle-income economies" (having a GNI per capita of \$1,026–\$4,035).
- SfN's Reduced Dues Category III includes countries in the category of "upper-middle-income economies" (having a GNI per capita of \$4,036–\$12,476).

The World Bank updates these lists annually and SfN makes adjustments as needed. Reductions and categories are based on an individual member's work and residence address. Members working and/or residing outside these geographical locations will be required to pay full membership dues.
